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Directions to Ride Site and Additional Information:

Address: 2964 E Barriere Lake Road, Barriere, BC (45 minutes north of Kamloops)

Ridecamp is situated along the beautiful Barriere River. Do NOT take your horse down to the river as there will be lot of water available at camp. Note: there is no potable water for human consumption, please bring your own. Ridecamp is on private property with no camping fees required. Ridecamp has three levels. The top level (at top of road) will be your vet-in area as well as the start and finish of the ride (and some ride parking) The second level will be for ride management, volunteers, pre-ride meetings, check-in and dinner/awards. The lower level near the river will be for rider parking. Porta-potties will be available. All parking will be clearly marked and you **MUST** park in your designated area!! Dogs must be crated or leashed at all times and their manure picked up. All manure is to be placed in neat piles near your rig. Remember this is private property, please keep it neat! Helmets are encouraged and mandatory for Junior riders and hoof protection is advised. This is a very rural area with lots of wildlife so be prepared. Wear bear bells if you like and **DO NOT** leave food out overnight such as apples, etc or you may have unwelcomed visitors. **NO FIRES!**

To reach ridecamp (~45 miles north of Kamloops):

Follow the signage to Barriere and come through town (lots of stores and shops for supplies including a feed Store). Turn right on South Barriere Lake road (after the Legion and the bridge) and follow this road 15Klm and look for the signage for **Kick Back Ranch** on your right. Make a right into the driveway. (If you get to Ski Park you have gone too far.) If your designated parking is on level one continue on, if your designated parking is on level three go left down the driveway following the Prison sign to the lower level.

There is no cell service or internet at the ride site and no landline available. Please advise anyone hoping to hear from you at home that you are out of any service area. There is a landline that takes messages at 250-672-2040 in the event of an emergency contact requirement. Messages are gathered early morning and late evening only.

About the trail:

The ride will leave the upper level of ridecamp and travel along tree lined logging roads along the border of South Barriere Lake and Johnson Lake. Water is available from the lake along the trail. The 25 mile ride will follow the logging roads to a beautiful meadow and then take a loop out of the meadow and back and then back along the logging roads to ridecamp. The 50 mile will proceed along the same route but with two different loops out and back from the meadow and then back to the ridecamp finish line. Outchecks will be held in the meadow with hay and alfalfa provided. The fun ride will follow the same route to the meadow and then return to ridecamp.

Check-in will begin at 2pm and vet-in will begin at 4pm, Friday, June 28. Our head vet is Dr. Rob Mulligan, second vet is Dr. Stefanie Krumsiek and a third vet, if required, will be announced. The Equestrian Canada Technical delegate is Joan Magee.

No Bitchin' Barriere Ride

As a participant in the No Bitchin' Barriere Ride, I agree to abide by the Rules of AERC and Equestrian Canada and the ride management. I understand that endurance riding involves being in remote areas for extended periods of time, far from communications, transportation and medical facilities; that these areas have many natural and man-made hazards which ride management cannot anticipate, identify, modify or eliminate: that horses can be excitable, difficult to control and unpredictable; and that accidents can happen to anyone at any time. I agree to take full responsibility for myself and the animal I am riding. I will hold AERC, EC and ride management, all ride personnel and volunteers and all property owners over whose land the ride passes, blameless for any accident, injury or loss that might occur due to my participation in this ride and free from all liability for such injury or loss.

Youth riders (under 18 years as of the first day of Jan.2019) entered in the ride will be accepted and allowed to ride only if accompanied by an adult rider (21 or over) Juniors will not be allowed to start or continue on from any point without an adjust sponsor. **JUNIOR RIDERS MUST WEAR PROTECTIVE HELMETS.**

I HAVE READ THE RULES, CONDITIONS AND REGULATIONS OF THIS RIDE (and read and understand and agree to Statement of Principles as listed on page 3) AND WILL ABIDE BY THEM. PARENT/GUARDIAN SIGNATURE GIVES PERMISSION FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL TREATMENT FOR JUNIOR.

Statement of Principles Co Sanctioned by EC as a Bronze level competition

Equine Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to:

- . Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- . Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subject to mistreatment;
- . Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- . Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- . Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- . Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition;
- . Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measure is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.
