Refund policy: A full refund of entry fee will be given to any applicant entered in an event provided that applicant has not started in the event. Once the applicant starts in the event, the entry fee is not refundable.

RIDER CHECK IN TIME 2:00pm UNTIL DARK on March 14, 2019--Head vet is Larry Nolan.

All days – we will have a lunch wagon available with fabulous food.

All junior riders must be accompanied by a sponsor at all times during the ride. The junior and the sponsor must complete within one minute of each other to qualify for AERC points.

- No smoking on trail. No dogs in vet area. Clean up all trash and manure; haul it out.
- All dogs must be controlled and on a leash. All trash must be removed from camp.
- Horses must be at least 5 years old to enter the ride; 4 years for the LD.
- Horses must have some type of hoof protection
- Horses must not be left unattended on the trail.
- Discourteous or unsportsmanlike conduct by a rider or their crew, including abusive treatment of animals or ride personnel, will result in immediate disqualification.
- Use of drugs according to AERC drug rules are prohibited.
- Stallions are welcome if handled and ridden by a competent adult.
- The same horse and rider must pass all control points and must stay on marked trails in order to qualify for completion.
- All horses must pass a pre-ride Veterinary inspection. Veterinary decisions are final.

RELEASE
