March 2 & 3, 2019

Trails: The trails consist of winding, flat, single track, permanently marked, wooded trails. There are a few road crossings on dirt or paved county roads. Hoof protection is not a requirement, but is recommended based upon a stretch along a gravel road.

There is an away check for LD and 55 mi. We will have vehicles available to carry supplies to the out of camp check. We recommend you have adequate supplies to leave in ride camp as it cannot be guaranteed when the supply vehicle will return to ride camp. More details will come at ride meeting.

Please pre-register: Please send the entry form filled out to the best of your ability. Bring a copy of the current negative coggins for every horse you are bringing. Current copy of your AERC membership card is required, as well. We are requesting that you send ONLY the NON_REFUNDABLE deposit with your pre-registration. Please see entry form.

Refunds: If you are not allowed to start the ride you will be eligible for a full refund (100%).

Coggins: You must present current negative coggins before unloading horses in Ride Camp. Health Certificates are required in the State of Mississippi if, for some reason, you encounter Law Enforcement.

Camp Opens Friday, March 1 at 9AM

Endurance Riding is an athletic event for both horse and rider in which the first goal is to complete the trail; the second goal is to ride this trail as expeditiously as the condition of the horse and rider will allow. Qualified veterinarians and ride managers will control the event. All equine must pass thorough veterinary examination before and during the event to be judged fit to continue. Upon crossing the finish line, the equine must pass another thorough veterinary exam prior to being allowed the "completion" status.

Camping: Camping is primitive with some parking pads and along the dirt / gravel driveway. Parking will be guided upon your arrival.

Directions: the Shockaloe Trail is located in the Bienville National Forest between Forest, MS and Morton, MS just north of U.S. Highway 80. Base Camp I is located ¼ mile north of U.S. Hwy 80 on Forest Service Road 513.

From the East: Follow I-20 W to MS-35 N in Forest. Take exit 88 from I-20 W.
Turn right onto MS-35 N (signs for Forest)
Turn left onto Fountain Dr - 1.4 mi
Turn left onto US-80 W/W 3rd St- Continue to follow US-80 W 4.2 mi.
Turn right onto 513 – Go .2 mi turn right into Base Camp I

From the West: Follow I-20 E to MS-13 N in Morton. Take exit 77 from I-20 E
Turn left onto MS-13 N (signs for Morton) 2.8 Mi
Turn right onto US-80 E - Pass by Sonic Drive-In (on the left in 1.3 mi)
Turn left onto 513 – Go .2 mi and turn right into Base Camp I

For Google Search – Shockaloe Horse Trails – Base Camp I

You are responsible for the containment of your horses. Horses are permitted to be hi-tied, temporary stall with panels or electric pens. Can be in the forest – however, no parking or driving is allowed in the forest. Vehicles stay on roads or parking pads, only.

There is running water at Base Camp I and II for horses. It is recommended that you bring human water. Stock tanks will be in camp, at away check, and at road crossings. The town of Morton is nearby about 2 mi. – Dollar General and Convenience Stores / Sonic. Forest, MS about 6mi. has a Walmart and a Tractor Supply.

Ride Camp opens at 9AM on Friday, March 1.

Ride Rules:

1. The equines are under the control of the Ride veterinarians who will do everything possible to help you evaluate your equine to make it possible for you to complete the ride without hurting your equine. The vets may disqualify any rider who has, in the opinion of the veterinarian, abused his/her equine. The veterinarian's decision will be final in all matters concerning the safety and well-being of the equines entered in the ride.
2. Ride management will refuse entry or disqualify any equine that presents a danger to anyone before, after or during the ride, in camp, on trail, or in a vet check.
3. Ride management will refuse entry or disqualify any rider that presents a danger to and/or behaves in an unsportsmanlike manner to anyone before, after or during the ride, in camp on trail or in a vet check.
4. Keep dogs on a leash. Please do not bring to vet area as they may excite horse/rider.
5. Proof of a negative Coggins test dated within 12 months is mandatory. Each equine entering the camping area is required to have this proof on hand. No entry will be accepted without proof of a negative Coggins test for each equine in their camp. Coggins papers may be checked at the gate by the MS Department of Animal Health. Please have yours available.
6. The ride is open to all breeds of equines (horses, mules, ponies, etc). The equine must be 60 months of age to enter the 55 mile ride and 48 months of age to enter the 30 mile ride – as of ride date.
7. A junior rider is a rider who was under the age of 16 as of December 1, 2018. Juniors must be accompanied by an adult sponsor entered in the ride, must list the sponsor on the entry form and must finish within one minute of the sponsor. Failure of either to wait on the other will result in the loss of completion of both riders. Sponsors may be changed only at vet checks and only with the approval of ride management. AERC ruling for 14-16 year old / 500 mile completion can apply, but all necessary paperwork must be presented with entry. **ALL JUNIOR RIDERS MUST WEAR APPROVED SAFETY HELMETS WHILE ON HORSEBACK REGARDLESS OF RIDE ENTRY STATUS.**
8. All riders must be present and accounted for at the start of the ride. Management strongly recommends ALL riders wear approved safety helmets while on horseback.
9. The same horse and rider must pass all checkpoints, follow the ride rules, stay on marked trail.
10. Vet criteria (pulse/respiration, holds, etc) will be discussed at ride meeting.
11. There are no minimum time limits for completion in any distance. Maximum time limits will be in accordance with established policy set forth by AERC. 30 miles – 7:15 including holds. 55 mi – 13:15
12. All riders must see a vet for a completion check or when pulling for ANY reason.
13. Riders are responsible for all vet fees and farrier fees that may be individually incurred.
14. Camp fires are dependent on weather.
15. No littering on trail.
16. All riders are responsible for their guests and crews. Any rider can be disqualified based on the behavior of their guests and crew members.
17. **NO TROTTING or RUNNING** through camp. Safety is of concern. Infractions can be cause for disqualification.
18. No ties. A tie at the finish line will only occur in the event that it is not possible to determine who finished first.

We hope everyone will come and have the best possible time at Shockaloe. These guidelines are designed with that in mind.

Waiver of Liability - Statement of Rider

I wish to enter and participate in the Shockaloe - Living Legends Rides, to be held Saturday and Sunday, March 2 & 3, 2019. I have read the rules, conditions, and regulations of the event and will comply with them. As a participant in the Shockaloe Living Legends Rides, I agree to abide by the rules of all applicable sanctioning organizations, including American Endurance Riders Conference, Southeast Endurance Riders Association, Texas Endurance Riders Association and those set forth by the aforementioned ride. I hereby knowingly execute this waiver of the right to sue and do hereby agree to assume all risks associated with participation in the ride. I agree that my participation in the event involves certain risks, which include but are not limited to, the following: 1) horseback riding involves being in remote areas for extended periods of time, far from communications, transportation, and medical facilities; that these areas can have many natural and man-made hazard which ride management cannot anticipate, identify, modify or eliminate, these hazardous surface / sub-surface conditions including such things as rocks, trees, puddles, streams, fences, jumps, and / or other hard objects and / or holes, divots, ledges which could cause and equine to trip and / or fall and / or strike a participant who falls from or is thrown from and equine; 2) that horses can behave in unpredictable ways which can result in accidents to anyone at any time, resulting in injury, sever injury, or death; 3) that an equine's reactions to sound, movements, objects, vehicles, persons, animals, scents, or insects cannot be predicted. I agree to take full responsibility for myself / my child, and the animal I/my child am/is riding. I will hold harmless the AERC, SERA, TERA, its officers and all individual members thereof, all ride personnel and any of its affiliates and any owner whose property this ride my cross, their successors, representatives, and assigns for any accident, injury, loss that might occur due to my participation in this ride, and free from all liability for such injury or loss, including that due to negligence not caused by willful misconduct of ride personnel. I further agree that should a claim of any nature arise under this agreement, said claim shall be submitted to binding arbitration before a neutral arbitrator mutually selected by all parties involved. Venue and law shall be governed by the location of loss incident claim. This release extends to ANY and all claims of every kind and nature whatsoever, whether known or unknown, and I expressly waive any benefits that I may otherwise have under provisions of the law of the State of Mississippi relating to the release of known claims. I understand that this release constitutes a limitation on my legal rights.

Under Mississippi law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting exclusively from the inherent risks of equine activities. (Code of Mississippi Act 443)

I hereby certify that my horse is not under the influence of medication and will not be treated with or given any medications prohibited by AERC rules. The undersigned verifies acceptance of risks and responsibilities for rider's and horse's conditions and certifies that all information on this form is correct to the best of his / her knowledge.

THIS AGREEMENT IS BINDING UPON ME, MY SPOUSE, LEGAL REPRESENTATIVES, HEIRS, EXECUTORS AND ASSIGNS. I HAVE READ THE ABOVE, UNDERSTAND IT, AND AGREE TO ABIDE BY THIS.
