Motion Name EN publication of Fielding and Dechant's paper detailing colic treatment in endurance horses

Proposed Motion (use exact wording)

Pay \$144 plus VAT (approximately 14%) to John Wiley & Sons for the right to publish Fielding and Dechant's 4-page paper in a future issue of EN. Finances to come from dedicated moneys already within the Research Committee's funds.

Background, analysis and benefit (describe the problem this motion is solving)

Concerning the 75 fatalities reported to the AERC from 2002 through 2011, 61% of fatalities were characterized by an acute abdominal crisis (colic), with gastric rupture confirmed at necropsy in 22% of all fatalities autopsied.

A 2011 scientific paper examined 36 horses that showed signs of colic within 48 hours of a ride and were presented to two Californian referral hospitals (Fielding and Dechant, Colic in competing endurance horses presenting to referral centres, *Equine Veterinary Journal*, ISSN 0425-1644, DOI: 10.1111/j.2042-3306.2011.00462.x). Thirty of the 36 horses demonstrated ileus on presentation, five horses required exploratory abdominal surgery, and all but one survived. The authors concluded "this group of horses has an excellent prognosis if owners and clinicians are prepared for prolonged medical treatment in some cases."

As an educational benefit, the publication of this scientific paper in the EN would serve the AERC membership by providing valuable, first-hand, scientific information concerning the management of the most common cause of fatality in this sport.

The appropriateness of this scientific information for the general membership was asked of Troy Smth, EN editor. She responded, "I think our members would like to read this (especially that very rich, data-filled chart)." A short, rider-friendly, summary and interpretation with emphasis on practicality to endurance riders is planned to accompany the scientific article.

8.2.1 These points cannot be recovered, but the miles may be recovered for career mileage credit by contacting the AERC office

Rule 8.2 states that members whose dues are not paid by February 1st will receive no points or miles for rides held between December 1st and the date their membership is restored. However rule 8.2.1 states that miles may be recovered with no reference to when or what type of mileage credit is allowed. The two rules contradict each other. Miles may be recovered for career mileage credit only and the rule needs to clearly state as such.
