Dr. Knott icompleted her bachelor's degree in Biology at Binghamton University and continued to the University of Tennessee College of Veterinary Medicine, graduating with awards in both equine medicine and surgery. After graduation in 2017, Lindsay completed internships at both Equine Sports Medicine and Surgery in Weatherford, Texas, and Louisiana State University, then completed a Large Animal Surgery Residency at Michigan State University in 2022. Her professional interests include orthopedic and soft tissue surgery, lameness, and post-operative rehabilitation. She is in practice at Loomis Basic Equine Medical Center in Penryn, California.

Dr. Fielding attended college at Harvard University where he rode for the equestrian team (jumping). He attended veterinary school at UC Davis, then completed a large animal internship at Texas A&M University. Dr. Fielding began working at Loomis Basin Equine Medical Center in 2003 and is currently one of the owners. Dr. Fielding has over 30 research publications on topics including electrolyte and fluid therapy, emergency medicine, endurance horses, and neonatal foals. He is the coeditor of *Equine Fluid Therapy*, the only textbook focused on fluid and electrolytes in horses. Dr. Fielding received his MBA through the Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania.

Dr. Dowling is a professor of veterinary clinical pharmacology at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada, and the founder and co-director of the Canadian gFARAD. She graduated from Texas A&M in 1983 (BS Animal Science) and 1987 (DVM) and completed a residency and Master's at Auburn University. Dr. Dowling has been teaching veterinary pharmacology at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine since 1993 and has received numerous teaching awards including the Norden Distinguished Professor award and the Provost's Teaching Excellence Award.
