
The Dr. Gail Conway Memorial Ride River Run March 2 & 3rd, 2024

# **Camp Details**

Friday at noon, at The Land Heritage Institute, 1349 Neal Rd., San Antonio, TX, 78264. Just off 1604, Applewhite exit, south of San Antonio. (See directions)

If you need to arrive on Thursday, there is an extra \$10 charge from LHI, please e-mail or call Eron. Hook-ups are for ride staff.

All horses must have a current Coggins and out of state horses a health certificate. All horses must be at least 48 months, including Intro horses.

As you drive in, please stop at check-in for parking instructions and have your papers handy. All horses will be checked at this time for matching Coggins. You will be given a liability release to sign for everyone in your party.

There is more trailer parking than in the past. However, it is really hard to save spaces because trailers need to be able to get into the parking spaces. As usual we will have parking helpers to guide you.

**ONE HORSE PER ELECTRIC PEN**. Electric pens must be hot. If you have containment issues, contact me. This is for everyone's safety. Panel pens need to be secure as well. This is very important. If you have not camped with your horse, please practice before the ride. No potable water, fill your trailers before you come. Plenty of horse water in camp and on trail.

# Very Important LHI rules

You cannot bring alcohol onto the property. Please, no smoking on the trails or grounds. LHI requests NO riding on Monday. They close the gates at noon on Monday. Before you leave, be sure your area is clean.

**Dogs** must be on a leash, or in a pen, or stay at your camp. And you MUST clean up after them. This is a LHI request. Best to keep them out of the main event area. Plus, the grounds have stickers and coyotes roam at night. Gates will be closed at night for our safety.

### Arrival Time

Please call Eron about your arrival time. Esp. if arriving after dark. Even if you arrive in the dark, someone will meet you as you drive in to check your papers, sign the release, and help you to a parking area., call or text.

If you need to arrive early on a ride morning, we need to know that as well. Arrangements for you will be made. The vets will check your horse before the ride starts.

#### Registration

Begins Friday 12:00pm. You MUST *Pre-register for this ride.* Your entry fee covers riders on the day of their ride only, so you can not ride other days. All trails are used for the ride. You can pay at registration and make changes, if necessary.

Please be sure you fill out the Vet card with your information and your horse. You are responsible to make sure AERC has you riding the correct horse. Put your number on the right side of the horse, that's the side the timers see.

#### Manure

This year everyone must pick up their manure. This needs to be done regularly so that your horses do not mash it down. There will be plenty of manure stations. Bring your own manure fork.

#### **Ride Meetings**

Fri. about 6:30-7, we'll honk a horn. Sat by 7, with awards after all riders are in on Sat. On Sunday, awards after each distance or before you leave. Any changes will be posted.

#### Approximate Ride Start times

Both days: 6:30 - 50 mile; 7:15 - 25 mile; 8:00 - Intro ride (times are approximate and may change due to weather.) You'll give your number to Eron, RM, in the open area before the start time.

#### **Junior Riders**

AERC rules pertaining to junior riders apply to all distances (including Intro Riders). Junior riders must wear protective headgear while on horseback (in and out of camp) and be accompanied by an adult sponsor. Riders must notify ride management who the adult sponsor will be for each junior rider before the ride. **Sponsor, you must stay with your rider.** 

#### Intro and New Riders

Please, you must contact me personally before the ride. We all want to be sure your rides goes **smoothly.** There will be a special meeting for you right after the main ride meeting, so please attend the ride meeting. Happy to help you to make things easier.

If you are a new rider and need some information before the ride, I have clinic notes I can send you. If you have containment issues, please let me know before the ride, so I can help. If you need a ride partner, we can arrange that as well. River Run is a very good first time ride.

#### All riders

Please send entry and your membership number to Trina by the cutoff date, Feb.29th. Bring your coggins to check-in.

If you are mailing your entry, do so by the 24<sup>th</sup> of Feb. to receive them in time. Jot Form Entries must be sent by the 7 pm on the 29th. The online form works, bring paperwork and payment to registration. You must pre-register, it really helps the ride run smoothly, thank you. We will keep the ride open until the 29<sup>th</sup>! If you enter but can't come, please let us know as soon as possible.

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#### Liability Release The Gail Conway Memorial Ride both Legal and Medical Release

As a participant in the River Run Endurance Ride, I \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ agree to abide by the rules of AERC, TERA, and the Land Heritage Institute. I understand that endurance riding involves being in remote areas for extended periods of time, far from communication, transportation, and medical facilities, that these areas have many natural or man-made hazards which ride management cannot anticipate, identify, modify or eliminate: that horses can be excitable, difficult to control and unpredictable; and that accidents can happen to anyone at any time. I agree to take full responsibility for myself and the animal I am riding. I will hold the ride management, all ride personnel, and all property owners over whose land the ride covers, The Land Heritage Institute and its Board, blameless for any accident, injury or loss and free from all liability of such injury or loss that may occur due to my participation in the ride.

I acknowledge that I assume full responsibility for the safety of horse, my guests, and myself. By my signature, I hereby waive all rights to file a claim or lawsuit against Land Heritage Institute and all its personnel and Board, State of Texas, AERC, TERA, River Run Endurance Ride including all management, ride personnel, and all medical personnel, for any injury or damages which may occur during the time I am at the ride site.

Additionally, I agree to be fully financially responsible for any necessary emergency medical treatment by any medical person or institution in the event of injury or illness. I give my consent for and will be financially responsible for emergency medical treatment for myself, my horse, if I am unable to give informed consent.

**Directions to River Run:** 

The Land Heritage Institute is south of San Antonio, just off 1604, 1349 Neal Road less than a mile from Applewhite. Come in from Applewhite or your GPS may take you to the wrong gate. If you come from the north or east of San Antonio, on 281, take Loop 410 around San Antonio to I–37, or 281 south, then take 1604 west to Applewhite Rd. turn right (north) on Applewhite to the first road to the right, Neal Road. Go straight, then 1 mile to the AERC sign and large double gate. Follow the signs to the check–in.

From I–10 West take 1604 south past Somerset, past 16, to Applewhite, turn left, the first right onto Neal Road, 1.2 miles to the double gates. Or take I-10 to I-35, then Palo Alto exit go under the freeway, to Watson Rd., turn left on Applewhite, then right on Neal Rd.

Your GPS may take you to the wrong gate. Do not enter the back gate. Follow ribbons & sign to the front gate! There will be an AERC sign!

#### Ride Rules:

1. The equines are under the control of experienced ride veterinarians who will do everything possible to help you evaluate your equine in order that you may complete the ride without hurting your equine; however, you must accept responsibility for your equine and yourself. The vets may disqualify any rider who has, in the opinion of the vets, abused his/her equine. The

Veterinarian's decision will be final in all matters concerning the safety and well-being of the equines entered in the ride.

2. Proof of a negative Coggins test dated within 12 months for Texas and out-of-state equines is mandatory. Every equine entering the camping area must have a negative Coggins on site. Coggins papers may be checked at check-in.

3. The ride is open to all breeds of equines (horses, mules, ponies, etc.). The equine must be at least 60 months of age to enter the 50 rides. Equines entering the 25-mile limited distance ride must be at least 48 months of age.

4. A junior rider is a rider who was under the age of 16 the first day of the ride season. Juniors must be accompanied by a competent adult sponsor (21 years old or older) entered in the ride and must list the sponsor on the entry form and **must finish within one minute of the sponsor. If sponsor changes RM must know!** Failure of either to wait on the other will result in the loss of completion to both riders. Sponsors may be changed only at vet checks and only with the approval of ride management. AERC ruling for 14–16-year-old/ 500-mile completion can apply if management has a copy of the AERC letter. ALL JUNIORS ENTERED IN THE RIDE MUST WEAR APPROVED SAFETY HELMETS WHILE ON HORSEBACK regardless of ride entry status. 5. All riders must be present and accounted for at the start of the ride. Management strongly recommends ALL riders wear approved safety helmets while on horseback.

- 6. The same horse and rider must pass all checkpoints, follow the ride rules, stay on the marked trail and do the loops in the correct order to receive completion. The 50-mile placing will be determined by first horse to cross the finish line. Ties recognized only if management cannot determine placement. ALL equines must see a Vet for completion check or when pulling for any reason. All riders must display good sportsmanship, or be disqualified if reports of misconduct are verified.
- 7. Vet criteria (pulse/respiration requirements, holds, etc.) will be discussed at the pre-ride meeting, or given out. Keep this info. Riders are responsible for understanding this information. All equines in each distance must meet ride criteria within 30 minutes at the vet check, or be disqualified. The final pulse rate criteria for 50 milers will be 30 minutes after the equine crosses the finish line. Then within an hour present for all other criteria. For 25 milers, LDs, the riding time continues until a preset judging criteria of 60 heartbeats per minute or less is met. At Vet checks the equine must meet a reasonable pulse recovery based on ambient conditions within 30 minutes of arrival at the check point. At the finish, LD riders have 6 hours to finish the course, and an additional 30 minutes if needed to pulse down.
- 8. There is no minimum time limit for completion in any distance. Maximum ride time, including holds, for completion is 12 hours for 50 milers and 6 hours for 25 milers. No limit for Intro riders. The equine of all distances must be metabolically fit to continue and have no gait aberrations that are consistently observable at a trot and must have a pulse of 64 or less, last year it was 60; pulse of 60 or less for 25 milers. Riders will dismount for completion trot. For Best Condition judging, equines must present for a 15-minute CRI, then a onehour post-ride check 15 minute CRI time measured from the finishing time. To be eligible for Best Condition Award, riders must weigh before leaving vet check area.
- 9. Riders are responsible for all farrier and vet fees that may be individually incurred.
- 10. During the ride, dogs are to be on a leash or confined to rider's camp.
- 11. ONE HORSE PER ELECTRIC PEN ONLY, Multiple electric pens are fine. HORSES CAN BE TIED TO YOUR TRAILER OR A HIE TIE, OR IN STURDY PORTABLE PENS.
