TRAILS: Pole Canyon Ranch sits on the edge of the caprock escarpment. There is a mix of footing types on two-track ranch roads with rock, grass, packed topsoil, and sand. Canyons are numerous with steep climbs, descents, and creek crossings. Hoof protection is strongly recommended. There are creeks, ponds, and water troughs for water. There is extremely limited to no cell phone service on the trail.

RULES: Endurance is an athletic event for both horse and rider. The goal is to complete the marked trail within the time given as established by AERC standards with an equine that is fit to continue from checkpoint to checkpoint. Equines must pass a complete vet check before, during, and after the ride. All AERC rules will apply. Safety helmets are recommended for all riders but are required for juniors at any time they are on their equine, in camp or on trail. Junior riders must be accompanied by a designated adult sponsor (21 years or older) at all times during the ride. Juniors riding as Seniors must show AERC approval.

PRIZES: Completion award to all distances, Best Condition and possibly more ;)

AHA Awards: Purebred and Half Arabian will receive Champion, Reserve Champ, and Top 5 Plaques with ribbons. Best Condition awards will also be awarded to both divisions.

GATE HOURS: Ride camp will open on Thursday at 10:00 am, and close Sunday at 10:00 am.

Pole Canyon Ranch is open to the public. To arrive and camp outside official ride camp hours, please see https://polecanyon.com/ or with questions contact ride management. Registration opens at 12 pm Thursday. Vet check opens at approximately 3pm. Pre-ride meeting approximately 7pm.

<u>CAMPING</u>: A Pole Canyon Ranch camping form must be filled out with payment submitted at registration to receive your vet card and number. All RV hook ups are reserved for ride management and volunteers from Wednesday, October 2nd through Sunday October 6th. Payments for camping and pens are payable to Pole Canyon Ranch.

Pens will be available @ \$5 a night. FIRST COME FIRST SERVED. Water for horses and humans is available in the camp. All manure and hay must be cleaned from pens and moved to designated manure areas. Those who camp in the pasture may spread manure and hay. Do not spread shavings in the pasture! Please bag them or use a wheelbarrow to dispose of them in the designated area. There are bathrooms with showers. Dogs must be always on a leash. If you cannot keep your dog on a leash: LEAVE THE DOG AT HOME! NO DOGS ALLOWED AT THE RIDE MEETING OR FOOD TRUCK AREA.

No firearms allowed.

DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH AT ALL TIMES
NO DOGS ALLOWED AT THE RIDE MEETING OR FOOD TRUCK
NO DOGS ALLOWED IN THE RESTROOM YARD

Take responsibility for your dog's waste. There are trash barrels located near the pens.

Place all trash in trash barrels. RM will provide trash bags. Ask for one!!

Quiet time (Generators off) @ 10PM

Pens must be cleaned. Place manure through the wire fence at the wheat field east of the pens.

Wheelbarrows available at the pens.

DO NOT SCATTER SHAVINGS- use a wheelbarrow and place in wheat field Spread manure.

Pole Canyon Ranch is open range. Cows will come into camp. Keep hay inside your trailer!

Keep your trailer doors closed to prevent unwanted visitors!

This release applies during the time that I am permitted on the recreation premises. 
Getting to Quitaque, TX

Quitaque is located in northwest Texas, inside the triangle formed by I-27 between Lubbock and Amarillo and Highway 287 from Wichita Falls to Amarillo. It is on Highway 86, between Estelline and Tulia, in the beautiful Caprock Canyon country.

Quitaque is the home of <u>Caprock Canyons State Park and Trailway</u> (part of the same canyon system that includes Palo Duro Canyon) and the <u>Comanchero Canyons Museum</u>.

From Quitaque to the ranch

- 4 miles south on FM 1065.
- Turn right (west). Proceed on FM 689 for 4 miles.
- You'll see a cattle guard on the right. Our sign is to the east.
- Turn in and go 1/4 mile to parking areas.
